PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT - QUARTERLY REPORT

1. SUMMARY

- 1.1 This report gives the 2006/07 first quarter figures for the Best Value Performance Indicators (BVPIs) and Local Performance Indicators (LPIs) included in the 2006/07 Corporate Plan.
- 1.2 The Overview & Scrutiny (Community Services) Committee monitors the overall position and the performance indicators for which it has responsibility. The Overview and Scrutiny (Stewardship) Committee will monitor its own performance indicators.
